The Finnish Labour Temple opened in March 1910, but this workers' hall was a temple of a different sort, one where political, rather than religious devotion, was practiced. Under the Red Star tells the story of union organizers, strong minded women, athletic children, actors and even poets. This film seamlessly integrates archival footage, photos and fictionalized scenes shot on 16 mm film to bring to life the lively and dramatic past of the early years of Finnish immigration to Canada.

Kerttu Nuorteva, a Finnish-born Soviet citizen and spy was dropped into Finland by parachute in February 1942. She operated undercover in Helsinki until September 7th when she was arrested after a mistake she had made.

The Interrogation is, as the title reveals. the story about her interrogations that were conducted by three consecutive men. At first, they got no results. Kerttu. whose true identity was slowly revealed, refused to believe when she was told about the cruelty of Stalin's killing machinery that also targeted Finns, Little by little, her defences began to crumble as the World War was irrevocably turning in favour of the Soviet Union. In spite of her cooperation, Kerttu was sentenced to death. She was, however, saved by the ending of the war. This is a film about Kerttu Nuorteva's difficult and mainly impossible choices.



Lecture Bios

Petteri Mökkönen was one of the last Finnish children born in Viipuri before it was occupied by the Soviet Union 65 years ago in June 1944. Since retiring from British Columbia dept. of Education, Petteri has worked closely with Finnish war veterans. This year it has been 94 years since the end of civil War in Finland and after spending considerable time in Finnish and Russian archives Petteri has produced a multi media presentation about Finnish Civil war.

David Ratz is a lecturer in Lakehead University's History Department and a Doctoral Candidate with the University of Oulu, writing a dissertation on "The Canadian Image of Finland 1924-1947: Canadian Government Perceptions and Foreign Policy" (working title). David specializes in Canadian military and Finnish history and has published many articles in these fields. Over and above his academic background he brings 29 years of experience with the Canadian Forces, Army Reserve or Militia. He holds the rank of Major, in the Lake Superior Scottish Regiment, was awarded the Canadian Forces Decoration for 12 years good service and the 38 Canadian Brigade Group Commander's Commendation for his work establishing the Army reserve Co-op Education Programme with local high schools.

David Ratz will present two different lectures at Finn Thunder 2012. "Finnish Canadian Soldiers in the First World War" deals with a little known topic. Ratz's research concludes that the participation rate of Finnish Canadians in WWI was much higher than commonly thought. "Canada and the Reinterpretation of the Peace Treaty With Finland" examines the Finnish request made to Canada to have the 1948 Peace Treaty reinterpreted to allow the Finnish military to acquire modern weapons for defence. The request came in the wake of the famous "Note Crisis" of 1960-1961.

Helena Halmari is the editor-in-chief of the Journal of Finnish Studies and a professor of linguistics and Chair of the Department of English at Sam Houston State University. She has published some forty articles on language contact and pragmatics and is the author of Government and Codewitching: Explaining American Finnish and editor of Persuasion across Genres: A Linguistic Approach (with Tuija Virtanen). She is currently working on a monograph that details language maintenance patterns of Finnish Americans.

Dr. Halmari will be presenting "Maintaining Finnish as a Heritage Language," which addresses the following questions: How do the varieties of heritage Finnish differ from the varieties of Finnish spoken in Finland? What are the biggest challenges for the acquisition and maintenance of Finnish outside Finland? Outside Finland, is it possible to pass the Finnish language to future generations? What can be done to facilitate the maintenance of heritage Finnish? Where in the United States and Canada is it possible to study Finnish as a heritage language?

Adjunct Professor, Ph.D. Elli Heikkilä is the Research Director of the Institute of Migration in Finland. There is a new book published by the Institute of Migration

about Finns Abroad in which she is editor together with Saara Koikkalainen, from the University of Lapland, Finland.

Dr. Heikkilä is offering a lecture entitled "Finns Abroad: The profile of emigrants, their destination countries and thoughts about returning to Finland." The presentation gives the view of who are emigrating and from which regions in Finland to other countries. The analysis also includes information about the destination areas of the world, i.e. which countries and continents are most attractive for emigrants from Finland, and especially for Finnish citizens who have moved abroad in the 2000s. The emigrants are analyzed by demographic characteristics like age, gender, education, primary activity and economic sector.

Lecture Bios

European Social Fund -project conducted at the Institute of Migration and thus there is information about Finnish emigrants' thought about returning to Finland.

Lt. Col. Dr. Ty Kaipio is a Modern European historian, specializing in twentieth-century German history, particularly policy-making related to World War I and the Nazi era. His doctoral research, conducted in German and other European archives over three years, focused on the German war aims controversy raging at the time. Dr. Kaipio is a lecturer at Lakehead University and teaches, among other things, Finnish History and will present

"Mannerheim as 'Righteous Gentile': Finland and the Holocaust" at Finn Thunder 2012.

Dr. Saku Pinta is a documentary filmmaker, sheet metal worker, occasional university lecturer, and independent scholar. His doctoral studies, focused on the intersections between anarchism and marxism, were completed at Loughborough University in 2011. He is a first-generation Finnish-Canadian and his current research deals with the history of the Finnish membership of the Industrial Workers of the World (c.1905-1975) in Canada and the United States. An essay on this topic -'Educate, Organize, Emancipate: The Work People's College and the IWW' - is set to appear this year in Anarchist Pedagogies: Collective Actions, Theories, and Critical Reflections on Education.

Dr. Pinta will present Finn Thunder visitors with both a lecture and a screening and discussion of his latest documentary film. His lecture, "Education in Finnish Culture: The Case of the IWW Työväen Opisto," looks at the how, for over two and a half decades, the Työväen Opisto (Work Peoples' College; WPC) (1914-1941), based in Smithville, Minnesota, served as the educational institution of the Industrial Workers of the World (I.W.W.) union, dedicated to the cause of revolutionary

industrial unionism. This paper provides an historical account of the WPC, the Finnish working-class communities that supported it, its students, curriculum, faculty and staff during its period as an I.W.W. school.

Dr. Pinta will also discuss and screen his film "To My Son in Spain: Finnish Canadians and the Spanish Civil War," which traces the participation of Finnish Canadians among the 1700 Canadian volunteers in the Spanish Civil War from 1936-1937. The film looks at the motivations of the recruits and their experiences in Spain. This documentary features the story of Jules Paivio, one of the last living Canadian volunteers of the Mackenzie-Papineau Battallion of the "International Brigades". When Jules left from his home near Port Arthur (Thunder Bay), Ontario, his father, a famous Finnish poet, wrote a lasting lament: "To My Son In Spain".

Pirkko Karvonen began her artistic career as a textile artist and has enjoyed a solid reputation as one of Alberta's most talented and prolific textile artists. Her award-winning works have been displayed in countries all over the world and are enjoyed in public, corporate, and private collections, including the permanent collection of the Alberta Foundation for the Arts. Pirkko was a teacher of weaving and consultant with Alberta Culture Visual Arts Branch for over 30 years. She is the founder of Strathcona County Weavers, Handweavers, Spinners and Dyers of Alberta, and Tablet Weavers International Studies & Techniques (TWIST). She is the president of Guild of Canadian Weavers. Pirkko teaches from her Studio at Amisk Lake, Alberta.

Pirkko will present "Finn Factor in North American Weaving," which explores Finnish weaving patterns, influences, and experts in North American weaving. A Handweaver's Pattern Book by Marquerite Davison gives credit to "Finnish Legation" and also to Myrtle Westola for "translating excerpts from books" that were printed in Finland. Who were these aurthors? Pirkko will share interesting facts about the possible Finnish influences to North American weaving. For example, did you know that

Atwater's husband was a mining engineer in towns that had great numbers of Finnish immigrants. At Cranbrook Art Academy we find Loja Saarinen (head of the weaving department) and Marianne Strengel . Did you know that Harriet Tidball had extensive correspondence with weavers in Finland? What about Eva Anttila who gave tapestry lectures in USA and Helmi Vuorelma whose yarns are used in weaving.

Samira Saramo, a Doctoral Candidate at York University and a sessional lecturer at Lakehead University, specializes in the social history of Finnish immigrants in North America in the early twentieth-century. Samira's dissertation explores the daily life of Finnish North Americans in 1930s Soviet Karelia, with the use of personal letters and memoir sources. Samira is an active member of the Thunder Bay Finlandia Association and has organized the lecture program for Finn Thunder 2012.

Samira's lecture, "A Century of Finnish Canadian Letters," looks at the daily lives and experiences of Finnish immigrants from the 1860s to the 1960s, as revealed through letters written in Canada to family and friends in Finland. The letters highlight the themes of employment, food, language integration, health, family support and charity, encounters with other cultures, and gradual Canadianization. Through the immigrants' own words, new aspects of the immigrant experience are made refreshingly clear.

Join Eeva Solomon-Kontuvirta in a drop-in workshop and learn to make the traditional Finnish Himmeli. This workshop is ideal is for people who have never made one before or need a refresher on how to make a basic Himmeli. Come learn a tradiitonal art form that can open doors to an unlimited creative outlet and help you connect with your roots.

Dr. Veli Niinimaa lectured in Exercise Physiology at the University of Calgary and was subsequently appointed the Biathlon Chairman for the 1988 Calgary Winter Olympics. He has served as President of the Calgary Finnish Club, Board Member of the Finnish-Canadian Cultural Federation, and the Alternate Deputy Speaker for the Finnish expatriate Parliament, Canada Region. Veli's publications include North American Finn Pride: Suomi=Sauna+Sisu+Sibelius and North American Finn Facts: Suomi Source of Specific Subjects and Statistics. A new work on his family geneology will be published in Finland this summer.

Veli Niinimaa will share his extensive experience on conducting family geneology at Finn Thunder 2012.

Kathy Toivonen, artist/writer, and Kim Manduca BA, HBEd., artist/photographer, have collaborated over the past three years to produce A Century of Sisu 1910-2010: 100 years of Finnish tradition, culture and food in the Thunder Bay area. The book is a photo journal with vignettes that demonstrates the lasting Finnish lifestyle in the Thunder Bay area. Kathy and Kim will share their experiences of writing the book and some of their most fascinating findings.

Eric Jaakkola is a producer, director, host, and editor for Finnish Talk and Variety Shows that are aired on Community Public Access TV Cable Stations in Minnesota and also on the web, www.tiny.cc/finntalk

Eric was one of 80,000 war children who were sent to Sweden during WWII. He will talk about the voyage to Sweden on a freighter teeming with children, then about life in Sweden, plus share memories sent by his Swedish "sister," Eva. He will also show a short video of Eva and himself at a reunion back in Kallinge, Sweden in 1999. The photo is with Eva when Eric was six years of age. She is the daughter of the Swedish family Eric stayed with for two years from 1944 to the fall


