

My Good Friends, We meet again!


Welcome to the 75th Finnish Canadian Grand Festival, Finn Festival 2015. We are coming together once again to unite Finns from around the world.




Dear Friends,

LECTURERS

VELI NIINIMAA



"Expatriate Parliament"

The presentation reviews the formation of the Finnish Expatriate Parliament (USP/FEP) in 1996 as an organization affiliated closely with Suomi-Seura ry. That is followed by its present structure and operations in Finland. Next, its purpose is stated, accomplishments are listed and future objectives are discussed. Typical lobbying efforts with the Government of Finland and with some public agencies are shown. And lastly the Canadian USP / FEP operations

and representatives are presented. The brief history of the Finnish Expatriate Parliament will be reviewed along with its objectives and accomplishments and its work both in Finland and with the expatriates.

"Genealogy and It's Rewards"

The participants will first learn how to find who they are by discovering their deep ancestry and migration routes. That is followed by an overview of research methods for more recent ancestry throughout recorded history. The tools available for searching both ancestors and present relatives are discussed. Uses of accessible genealogical websites and a few computer applications are presented. The information available in church records, court records and the different types of archives is detailed. Various presentation formats of ancestry and present relatives are shown. And lastly, the difficulties and solutions faced by North American genealogists researching their Finnish ancestors are reviewed. With hard work and good luck it is possible to find a couple of thousand ancestors and over half a million relatives. Among them you will share many success stories and even more tragedies. In this presentation you will learn how to find out who you are and the successes and tragedies of those who share your genes.

"Publishing a Family History"

The presentation starts with an encouraging examination of the reasons to publish a family history and/or an autobiography. Two dozen persona, family and general sample chapters and a dozen sample appendixes are discussed to stimulate the participants with ideas on what they can include in their family history. The sources of genealogical information for stories of ancestors are discovered, including related newspaper articles. Items are suggested which can be used to enhance through scanning or digital photography. The book

writing process is reviewed briefly. Temporary and long lasting publishing options are discussed, ranging from simple to sophisticated publication methods. Marketing a family history and identity protection will be examined briefly. Handouts will be provided. The basics of publishing a family history at different levels of sophistication will be examined to encourage the making of these priceless gifts for future generations.

Dr. Veli Niinimaa, PH.D., Calgary, AB, Canada

Veli was born in Finland but completed his secondary and post- secondary education in Toronto., Dr. Niinimaa's interest in Finnish culture started by playing pesäpallo with the Sisu Athletic Club. Later he chaired two Finnish-Canadian Grand Festivals and served as the President of the Calgary Finnish Cultural Association. He also served two terms of the Finnish-Canadian Cultural Federation Board. IN 2008 he was elected the Alternate Deputy Speaker and in 2012 and 2015 the Chairman of the Canadian Region, Finnish Expatriate Parliament. Veli Niinimaa has published 17 books, some on North American Finns and Family Histories. He has written nearly 100 articles for journals and newspapers.

ROY BLOMSTROM



"The Finnish Civil War of 1918 – From Mystery to Novel"

Roy Blomström is a retired English teacher from Thunder Bay, Ontario. Two of his novels have been awarded Ontario Arts Council Writers' Works in Progress grants.

His memoir, "Pearl Street Hill," was shortlisted for the CBC's Literary Awards in 2005. Roy's prize-winning short stories, poetry, and memoirs have been published by the Northwestern Ontario Writers Workshop. Three of Roy's 10-minute plays have been performed at the 10by10 Showcase in Thunder Bay.

Roy's parents were Finland-Swedes from Ostrobothnia. His father, born in 1899, likely fought in the Finnish Civil War.

It should come as no surprise that to most people whose parents or grandparents emigrated from Finland, the Finnish Civil War comes as either a complete surprise or as a mystery wrapped in an enigma. This lecture is about the war; how and why it occurred, its legacy, and why it was, for the most part, forgotten. It is also about "Silences," a novel of the war set in 1918 in Finland, and in 1955 in Port Arthur, Ontario.

LECTURERS

ANU MUHONEN



"Letters from Somewhere Out There - Kirjeitä täältä jostakin"

Anu Muonen will discuss the themes and messages in family letters from two historical Finnish naval ships Suomen Joutsen and Ilmarinen during times of war and peace.

Muhonen received her MA from the University of Jyväskylä and a double PhD, from University of Jyväskylä and Stockholm University. During 2002-2014 she worked as lecturer and researcher at the Department of Finnish at Stockholm University in Sweden. Since 2014 she is professor and Director of Finnish Studies at University of Toronto. In her research, Muhonen has investigated multilingualism and identity among European youth, children and families. She is also currently exploring historical war letters.

KELLY SAXBERG



"Saving the Finnish Labour Temple One Pancake at a Time"

Kelly Saxberg is a film producer, director and editor who has worked on over 80 films. Kelly was the writer/ director/ editor of Under The Red Star, a feature length historical docu-drama shot on super 16 mm film in Finnish and English about the Finnish Labour Temple.

She co-directed /edited "Who was Sylvia" a short documentary about letters found at an abandoned Finnish homestead. "Letters from Karelia," is Kelly's first feature length documentary about Canadians who moved to the Soviet Union in the 1930's. It was also nominated for a Gemini for best history documentary in 2006. It won two Blizzards - Best Documentary and Kelly won Best Directing at the 2006 Manitoba Motion Picture Industry Awards.

Kelly has conducted numerous workshops on funding for film, camera technique, editing, and the use of programs like Avid and Final Cut Pro. She has been instrumental in the organization of independent film screenings in Thunder Bay. She is a co-ordinator and founder of the Bay Street Film Festival which has just completed its 9th year. She also volunteers as a consultant and crew member for emerging filmmakers in Thunder Bay.

RAIMO SALO

"Wonderful Life Of Hanssin Jukka DC2 Era Plane"



Raimo Salo, Producer/musician only son of a war veteran father, grew up on a small farm in Central Finland with 5 sisters. He showed interest in singing as a child and acquired his first guitar as a teenager. Salo started his musical career in the early 1970's as a guitarist in the Swedish band "Trollboys," and from 1973 to 1975 he performed in Finland with the Finlandia Orchestra. He then turned his concentration to officer duties in the Defense Forces. After retiring from the Air Force in 2006 as First Lieutenant, Salo returned to singing as a hobby. He has since performed with the Air Force Big Band as a soloist, and is known as the "Tenor Lieutenant." Salo currently specializes in interpreting wartime rarities such as Toivo Kärki's compositions from the front line during the war. In addition he has produced several TV documentaries with the Finnish Broadcasting Company. Raimo Salo is awarded with several medals of honour of his work for war veterans and lottas.

"Everybody is Important"



Timo Virtanen, aka. "The Lion of Finland" started "Everybody is important", a physical education project, which supports and gives school and sport aid for the children and youth who need help in difficult crises areas (Bosnia-Hertzegovina Years 1998 & 1999 and Afghanistan since year 2005 -). The project started in Helsinki in 1995 and this year is celebrating twenty years.

"Everybody is important" World Tour 2015 started in Toronto, Canada, March 17th – 24th. The book, "The Spirit of Fair Play", was published to celebrate this event. Timo also visited a warm and friendly place, Suomi-Koti, in Toronto.

I'm very happy to show all my friends in Canada our "Everybody is important" project and read my own poems from my two poetry books : "Sodanajan Tyttö – Laatokan Helmi" & "Isäni maa – Isäni maa" – Timo Virtanen.

LAURI VÄÄTTÄNEN

"Suomen asekätkentä"



Pelastiko asekätkentä Suomen? Yleisesikuntaupseeri Lauri Väätäsen teos Lauri Miettinen ja asekätkentä Vakka-Suomessa julkaistiin Suomessa vuonna 2014. Kirja syntyi 2 1/2 vuoden tutkimus- ja kirjoitustyön tuloksena. Teoksessa esitellään Tuusniemellä 1907 syntynyt Lauri Miettinen, kirjoittajan kummisetä, sekä hänen johtamansa asekätkentä Vakka-Suomessa.

70 vuotta sitten Suomi oli kovin erilaisten haasteiden edessä kuin tänä päivänä. Vaikka kirja nimensä mukaisesti kattaa asekätkennän Vakka-Suomen alueella, koskettaa aihe Suomea kokonaisuudessaan. Jokaiseen suojelespiiriin varastoitiin varustus noin pataljoonansuuruiselle joukolle.

Kirjoittaja Lauri Väätänen on syntynyt Uudessakaupungissa 7.9.1943. Hän on suorittanut upseerin virkatutkinnon 1967 ja yleisesikuntaupseerin tutkinnon 1977. Hän on palvellut Uudenmaan Jääkäripataljoonassa ja toiminut opettajana Kadetti- sekä Taistelukoulussa. Väätänen on palvellut rauhaneturvaajana Etelä-Libanonissa sekä entisessä Jugoslaviassa. Hän on myös palvellut Viron Suojeluskuntien pääliikön neuvonantajana 1993-1994 sekä Viron Maanpuolustuskorkeakoulun johtajan neuvonantajana 1999-2004.

RAIMO SALO



Toivo Kärjen syntymästä tulee 3.12.2015 kuluneeksi tasan 100 vuotta ja Salo on tehnyt jo 10 vuotta yhteistyötä Topin nuorimman pojan Kalervo Kärjen kanssa.

"Kärjen arkistoista tuntuu aina vaan löytyvän harvinaisuuksia eikä ihme, koska Toivo Kärjen ammattiura kesti 59 vuotta, ja sävellyksiä levytettiin hänen elinaikanaan noin 1400. Lisäksi häneltä jää suuri määriä julkaisemattomia valmiita kappaleita, sillä hän osallistui mm. kaikkiin mahdollisiin sävellyskilpailuihin. Aineistosta on hyvä ammentaa, ja juhlalevylle nimeltä Muistojen maa tuleekin kaksi ennen julkaisematonta iskelmää; Tango Unohtumaton ilta vuodelta 1944, sanat Olavi Karu ja savottaralli Kympin suma vuodelta 1951, sanat Reino Helismaa.

Lisäksi levylle tulee ensi kertaa täydelliset versiot kappaleista Muistojen maa ja Imatran Inkeri, joten koko levy

koostuu kantaesityksistä."

Salo tekee 2015 aikana lehtimäkeläisen harmonikkataiteilija Heikki Jokiahon kanssa Muistojen maa -konsertteja Kärjen juhlavuoden kunniaksi. Kesällä 2015 he esiintyvät Toronton suurjuhilla. Hänellä on mukana myös lottadokumentti Viimeinen testamentti, jota esitetään Kärki-konserttien yhteydessä.

Lottadokumentti Viimeinen testamentti

1939-1944 sotiemme aikana 240 000 lottaa teki vapaaehtoista maanpuolustustyötä kotirintamalla ja sotatoimialueilla.

Lotta Svärd järjestö lakkautettiin marraskuussa 1944 ja siitä alkaen nämä naiset ovat vaienneet noiden aikojen tapahtumista.

Muusikko/tuottaja Raimo Salo on toteuttanut Lotta Svärd Säätiön ja Lottamuseon kanssa maamme historian laajimman lottaperintein keräämisprojektiin ja haastatellut 92 lottaa kautta maan.

Keräystä aineistosta on leikattu tunnin mittainen Viimeinen testamentti-dokumenttielokuva (dvd), joka valmistui myyntiin Lottamuseolle kesäkuussa 2013.



AMERIKAN LAULAJAT

Finnish Male Singers of North America

Poet Longfellow wrote, "Music is the universal language of mankind". It is a powerful force that can instantly communicate cohesion and unity between peoples. And so, in the early years of the twentieth century, Finland sought to build a bridge to the Americas by exporting some of its finest musical talents. Choir song has long defined Finnish culture and numerous choral groups toured Canada and the United States during this period. In response to these visits, the idea of a 'good will' trip to Finland by a North American male chorus was born. A committee formed, in 1954, from the ranks of the New Yorkin Laulumiehet (Finnish Male Chorus of New York) chose the name **AMERIKAN LAULAJAT** (AL) and began seeking singers and monies for this endeavor. Two years later 36 men, representing 19 cities throughout the U. S. and Canada, departed New York harbor aboard the MS Stockholm on what would become the first of nine AL tours of Finland.

Under the inspired direction of Jussi Himanka and Ralph Harju the 1956 tour was a resounding success. Seventeen concerts were staged in as many cities with capacity crowds attending every performance. Each of these hosting cities showered the singers with gala receptions. All of this has become the hallmark of subsequent tours.

Male choral enthusiasm billowed throughout North America and in 1962 a combined festival (Mieskuoropäivät) was held in Toronto. At this gathering, the attending singers voted to establish **Amerikan Laulajat** (Finnish Male Singers of North America) as the formal umbrella organization of the continent's Finnish male singers. Seven choirs participated in this event and throughout the years three more have joined the group (Sibelius Male Chorus of Chicago, Finlandia male Chorus of Detroit, Finnish Male Chorus of New York, Otava Male Chorus of Thunder Bay, Kaleva Male Chorus of Sault Ste. Marie, Sudbury Finnish Male Choir, Finnish Male Chorus of Toronto, Finnish Male Chorus of Los Angeles, Finnish Male Chorus of Vancouver, and Male Singers of Florida).

The ninth Finland tour took place in 2002 and the thirty-third combined festival will occur in Toronto during **FINNFESTIVAL 2015**.

Vanhustenhoidosta on kirjoitettu näytelmiä ennenkin, mutta HARMAAT PANTTERIT tarjoaa aktiivisia, eläviä ihmisiä – vaikka "AINUT EHYT PAIKKA RUPISSA ON TEKOHAMPAAT", kuten kärtyisä Laimi valittaa. Näytelmä kyseenalaistaa myös median ja monien järjestöjen luoman myytiin siitä, että kaikki on kiinni rahan ja henkilökunnan puutteesta.

Moni meistä ottaisi mielummin Kaari Utrion tarjoamat kuolinpillerit kuin viruksi vuosikausia terveyskeskuksen kroonikko-osastolla.

HARMAAT PANTTERIT ei sievistele, mutta ei myöskään lamaannuta katsojaa. Se lähestyy suomalaisen nyky-yhteiskunnan häpeällisintä ilmiötä komedian keinoin. HARMAAT PANTTERIT kertoo suomalaisesta vanhainkodista, jonka asukkaat on tainnutettu vihanneksiksi lääkkeillä ja ankeilla rutuineilla. Talon uusi johtaja ei kuitenkaan alistu vanhoihin, helpoiksi tiedettyihin kaavoihin, vaan nostattaa vanhukset kapinaan.

Vanhainkodin asukkaat ovat värikäitä ja suorapuheisia persoonia, joiden tolskauksille on pakko nauraan.

Pohjalla kulkee kuitenkin vakavia kysymyksiä: Miksi vanhuksista ei huolehdita ihmisoisella tavalla?

Miksi hoitohenkilökunta uupuu työhönsä? Olisiko asenteissakin korjaamista? Kyynisyys tuskin katoaa tämänkään näytelmän myötä, mutta aivan varmasti se herättää keskustelua.


TORONTO FINNISH THEATRE COMPANY

Here's an interesting fact that probably most Finns living in Toronto aren't even aware of: my dad's cousin, **David Korhonen**, was the pilot who flew the 10 ton Sikorsky helicopter "Olga" that attached the 102 metre steel broadcasting antenna to the top of the CN Tower!
